#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

### 1. What is the objective of the ECDA Fellows Programme?

First introduced in 2015, the ECDA Fellows Programme recognises senior early childhood leaders who display exemplary leadership and expertise and creates opportunities for them to drive quality improvements in the sector. It also contributes to greater career development opportunities for seasoned leaders in the sector.

#### 2. How are ECDA Fellows selected?

ECDA Fellows are appointed based on the following criteria:

- a. Deep expertise in the field of early childhood care and education;
- b. <u>Strong leadership</u> in developing quality practices for the sector and building a culture of professionalism, collaboration, trust and teamwork among the early childhood fraternity; and
- c. <u>Exemplary professionalism</u> that would make them good role models for other early childhood educators.

## 3. How does ECDA support the ECDA Fellows?

ECDA supports ECDA Fellows in their pursuit of Inquiry-Based Action Plan (IBAP) projects that contribute to the sector. Beyond IBAP, ECDA works with each ECDA Fellow on other sector-level roles that he/she will play during the appointment term.

ECDA also supports ECDA Fellows with various professional development opportunities, which include a milestone course for newly appointed ECDA Fellows, an overseas study trip and a professional development grant during their three-year term.

In recognition of their contributions, ECDA Fellows each receive a Service Recognition Allowance of \$9,000 if they complete an average of 100 sector-level service hours per year.

# 4. Can the new ECDA Fellows be re-appointed after their previous appointment term ends?

The newly appointed ECDA Fellows will be on a three-year term, subject to confirmation upon their first year of service. Upon completion of the first term of appointment, ECDA Fellows can be re-appointed.
