


Go On A Romp Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve ■ Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve

The new extension that opened in 2014 houses a visitor centre that features a multimedia gallery and games for children to enjoy. Trek through the adventure trails with your child and get up close to the wildlife such as mudskippers, crabs, water snakes, birds, spiders, monitor lizards and otters. September to March is migratory season, so look out for the diverse flocks of shorebirds or waders including plovers and sandpipers.

Take A Guided Learning Tour Singapore's maritime landmarks

The Singapore Maritime Trails are organised by the Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore. The free tours run every first Saturday of the month, and take about 2.5 hours to complete. It's a great way for children to learn about our history as a trading port, as they visit old and new maritime landmarks including Fort Canning, the Singapore River and The Fullerton Hotel.





Marine Cove's outdoor playground
Take your child on a great physical
workout to this new megaplayground. Play elements include
a 8m-tall tower, three slides, a rope
bridge and climbing net courses.
There are many other play equipment
catering to children of all ages and
abilities, including those with special
needs. Sensory play panels, for
example, help to hone motor skills and
hand-eye coordination. If you intend
to spend an entire day here, there are
shower facilities for the children and
a good variety of eateries.
