I was excited to have celebrated with all the professionals in the sector at my first Early Childhood Conference (ECC) this year. We thank the 1,500 conference participants, over 10,000 exhibition visitors, our speakers and all our partners for making this sector event a huge success.

In conjunction with the ECC, three signature sector events were held.

- Awards ceremony: We presented 22 awards to leaders, educators and centres for their exemplary and innovative Roald Dahl aptly reminds us, "...the teaching and learning practices. We hope that the winners will continue to strive towards professional excellence and share their good practices with the fraternity.
- SPARK certification presentation ceremony: 112 preschools received their SPARK certification, bringing the total number of SPARK-certified centres to more than half of the preschools in Singapore.

• Start Small Dream Big (SSDB) Finale: We applauded the efforts of 49,000 children from over 820 preschools for their contributions under the President's Challenge SSDB movement. They spent 1.4 million hours on community service projects for charity.

This year's conference was organised with the theme of outdoor learning. Research shows that outdoor learning stimulates the brain, improves children's ability to focus and learn, and allows our children to learn with multiple senses.

Playgrounds, parks, gardens, museums and even one's immediate neighbourhood provide our children with a rich repertoire of learning opportunities.
