


Cut each sheet of paper into 25cm x 8cm. Fold each one into half, and trim the open end into a semi-circle.



- 2 Start at the fold and cut three slits (around 8.5cm) into each piece – do not cut right through to the end.
- 3 Place both pieces of paper perpendicular to each other and label each strip on them:
 D-C-B-A for the left piece, and 1-2-3-4 for the right one.
- 4 To start weaving, take
 Strip 1 and loop it
 around Strip A. Next
 weave Strip 1 through
 Strip B. Continue by
 weaving Strip 1 around
 Strip C. Finish by
 pushing Strip 1 into
 Strip D. Shift Strip 1 up
 until it touches the top
 of the slits.



KETUPAT HEART BASKET


Teach your child about Male

Teach your child about Malay culture through this Hari Raya-inspired weaving craft.

ari Raya celebrations are colourful affairs. In most Muslim homes, you will usually find ketupats (rice cakes) laid out as part of a feast, as well as ketupat decorations woven from ribbon or paper. Helping your child to make a ketupat-inspired heart decoration will expose him or her to our rich ethnic diversity. Weaving the heart will help your child to develop concentration. The craft also promotes hand-eye coordination. It will also help your child to develop patience and acquire sequencing skills, which in turn will improve the ability to process and understand information. *

MATERIALS

- Two sheets of A4 construction paper in different shades of green
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Glue (optional)
- Ribbon (optional)



Weave Strip 3 using step 4, and weave Strip 4 using step 5. Neaten the strips to finish.
