# Puppet Play



# Did you know that puppets can...

- Help children to explore different feelings and behaviours
- Enable children to take on different perspectives
- Provide opportunities for children to develop insights of themselves and their peers
- Empower children with skills to read social and emotional cues
- Develop in children a sense of empathy

Children love pretend play! Imagining and creating stories and scenarios. Puppets are a great teaching resource for educators to build young children's social and emptional skills

Through puppet play, educators can help children to understand and regulate their emotions and behaviours, be empathetic, and build positive relationships.

While the children are engaged and having fun with the puppets, there are several other benefits. Puppet play can stimulate children's development in many aspects – creativity, thinking, problem-solving, language and communication skills.



Here is a set of puppet characters created specially for educators to support children's social and emotional development.

These characters embody special dispositions and qualities such as confidence, serenity, empothy and being respectful and responsible.



#### Tips for using the Puppets:

Introduce the characters. Describe the characteristics of each puppet. Talk about what it means to be confident, serene, empathetic, respectful and responsible.

Plan a puppet show.
Together with the
children, make a
puppet stage with
props from recycled
materials. Plan for a
puppet show using the
different characters.

Dedicate a character week. Children can have an entire week exploring the character's traits, values and dispositions. Create a 'feelings' wall chart to expand children's emotional vocabulary.

Visit the library. Borrow books that are relatable to each of the puppet characters. As you read the stories, As you read the stories, and emotions. Ask open-ended questions to extend thinking, such as "How do you think the character is feeling?", "Why do you sou that?"

Role play. Children can create their own stories or scenarios for each puppet character. Help children process their feelings in managing certain situations. For instance, children to suggest ways of managing a specific emotion such as when they are angry or sad.
