The Community in Nature (CIN) Schools Award is a new recognition scheme to acknowledge, appreciate and celebrate the works of our schools, as well as to motivate educators and students to contribute to local biodiversity conservation efforts.

It aims to:

- Recognise proactive partners from various educational institutions that have contributed to biodiversity conservation.
- Encourage stakeholders from the education sector to take on a more active role to conserve our biodiversity.
- Provide a networking platform for schools to share and exchange biodiversity-related knowledge and experiences

Target audience: Schools, teachers, and students from preschool to junior college

Frequency: Biennial on even years

Training: Not applicable

Prerequisites: Participating schools should have completed at least one biodiversity-related project within the past two years.
